WAC calls on Noreen Hay to resign

Wollongong Against Corruption demands that Noreen Hay resign as Member for Wollongong. According to WAC spokesperson Paul Matters “Noreen Hay has brought disgrace to the NSW Parliament and the people of Wollongong. Ms. Hay should resign and a by-election called.”

“At a public meeting organised by Wollongong Against Corruption in March, people voted overwhelmingly for a Royal Commission into corruption in this region.”

“The latest revelations into the Wollongong Corruption scandals highlight what the community has been saying all along that we urgently need a Royal Commission into corruption.”

“Ms Hay says that ICAC found that she was not a person of interest” says Paul Matters. “ICAC hasn’t been doing its job. Attention is focused on small players. We have lost confidence in this ICAC inquiry. ICAC must be under-resourced, under-skilled and/or under-pressure.”

“WAC says there needs to be a Royal Commission into corruption in Wollongong to investigate relationships between developers and the NSW Government”.

“The community is outraged by the level of corruption in this city and the attempted cover up by the NSW Government”

“The community owes a debt of gratitude to Mr Gigliotti in showing courage and integrity by coming forward” says Paul Matters. “Along with the other sacked Labor Councillors, Mr Gigliotti has borne the brunt of community criticism for months. We do not believe that these four expelled Labor Party members are the central players in this scandal. We urge the others to join Mr Gigliotti and make statutory declarations”.
